The Zuckerman Israeli Postdoctoral Scholars Program provides additional support to Israeli PhD graduates who have been accepted to a postdoctoral program with a stipend at an American university.

Candidates are encouraged to apply to a university that offers more specialized training than they would find in Israel.

In the 2023-2024 academic year, 5 Israeli postdoctoral scholarships will be given out to 8 participating universities: Ariel University, Bar-Ilan University, Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, University of Haifa, The Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Technion - Israel Institute of Technology, Tel Aviv University and Weizmann Institute of Science.

Two out of the 5 scholarships will be reserved for women.

DURATION, FUNDING AND ELIGIBILITY

- Zuckerman Israeli Postdoctoral Scholarships are for up to two years.
- Zuckerman Israeli Postdoctoral Scholars receive a stipend of \$20,000 US per academic year, plus a \$5,000 US travel allowance to return to Israel once per academic year during their postdoctoral appointment.
- Candidates must hold a Ph.D. degree from one of the 8 participating universities, or if still studying for a Ph.D., must submit their Ph.D. thesis before October 1, 2023.
- Candidates who commenced their postdoctoral position before October 2022 are not eligible to apply.
- Candidates must be accepted to a postdoctoral program at an American university or research institute that includes a stipend for work and study. They must obtain consent from a potential hosting supervisor at that university or research institute.
