The "Chateaubriand" Fellowships Program

For Israelis willing to conduct research in France

Training Research Fellowships - High Level Scientific Stay

- Israeli PhD students and young scientists, willing to conduct research in France may qualify for the French Government Chateaubriand fellowships program. Research will be performed in a French University or a French Public Research Center.
- Before applying, the young researchers must contact the French host institution to get a formal and detailed invitation letter.
- These fellowships are available for a period of **4 to 6 months during 2025**, with a monthly stipend of 1,704 to 2,055 Euros.
- Eligible fields of research: Exact Sciences, Social Sciences and Humanities (medical and specialization internships in French hospitals and clinics are not included in this program).

Applications

- The 2025 Call is open from October 28 until December 18, 2024.
- Acceptance/rejection notification by February 28, 2025.

Important Remarks

- Israeli citizenship; dual French-Israeli citizenship owners not eligible.
- PhD. students must be enrolled at a PhD program in an Israeli university.
- Candidates should provide a valid employment contract or a fellowship attestation from an Israeli research institution.
- Departure to France: not earlier than March 1, 2025.
- Return to Israel: at the latest on December 31, 2025.

Age

- For PhD. students, should be born after March, 1st 1990.
- For researchers, should be born after March, 1st 1985.

French

No French language mastering level required; however, getting a level of small talk is advisable.

Information Sessions

Two information sessions will occur in November: in Tel-Aviv on the 8th and in Jerusalem on the 15th. It is a great opportunity to hear about the Chateaubriand fellowships program, to ask questions about France, its research and high-education system. The attendance is free; however, the registration is mandatory on our <u>Website</u>.
